Establishment of Anti Ragging Committee (As per All India Council for Technical Education notified Regulation for prevention and prohibition of ragging in AICTE approved Technical Institutions vide No. 37-3/ Legal/ AICTE/ 2009 dated 01.07.2009)

Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging

In view of the directions of the Honorable Supreme Court in SLP No. 24295 of 2006 dated 16-05-2007

and in Civil Appeal number 887 of 2009, dated 08-05-2009 to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge

of ragging, in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 23 read with Section 10 (b), (g), (p) and (g)

of AICTE Act, 1987, the All India Council for Technical Education has notified Regulations for prevention

and prohibition of ragging in AICTE approved Technical Institutions vide No. 37-3/ Legal/ AICTE/ 2009

dated 01.07.2009 available on the AICTE Web-Portal [http:// www.aicte-india.org/anti.htm](http://www.aicte-india.org/anti.htm)>download.

All AICTE approved Technical Institutions have to comply the provision made in the above Regulations.

Any violation of above AICTE Regulations for prevention and prohibition of ragging, shall call for punitive

action against erring Institutions as per provisions made in the above said Regulations.

The Institutions shall have to step up Anti-Ragging mechanism by way of adequate publicity through

various mediums:

- Constitution of Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti Ragging Squad;
- Setting up of Anti-Ragging Cell;
- Installing CCTV cameras at vital points;
- Anti-Ragging Workshops;
- Updating all Web sites with Nodal Officers complete details, alarm bells etc.;
- Regular interaction and counselling with the students;
- Identification of trouble-triggers;
- Mention of Anti-Ragging warning in the Institution's prospectus and information Booklets/ Brochures shall be ensured; and
- Surprise inspection of hostels, student's accommodation, canteens, rest cum recreational rooms,

toilets, bus-stands and any other measures which would augur well in preventing/ quelling ragging and any uncalled for behaviour/ incident shall be undertaken.

The Institution approved by AICTE may be requested to hold Workshops and Seminars on eradication of

ragging in higher educational Institutions. They may be requested to display Anti Ragging posters at all

prominent places such as Admission Centre, Departments, Library, Canteen, Hostel, Common facilities etc.

The size of posters should be 8x6 feet.

The Institution may be requested to submit online compliance of Anti-Ragging Regulations on curbing

the menace of ragging in the Technical Institutions, 2009 at www.antiragging.in.

Institutions may be requested to make it compulsory for each student and every parent to submit an online

undertaking every academic year at www.antiragging.in and www.amanmovement.org.

ANTI RAGGING

Ragging is totally prohibited in AIT's Institute of Pharmacy, Malegaon and in its Constituent Institutes inside and / or outside the campus and anyone found guilty of ragging and / or abetting ragging whether actively or passively, or being a part of conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with UGC Regulations 2009 as well as under the provisions of any penal law for the time being in force. AIT's Institute of Pharmacy, Malegaon ensures that the congenial and welcoming environment is given to the freshers. To achieve this objective following committees have been formed by the Institute as per UGC Regulation 2009:

Roles and Responsibilities of Committees

1. To make surprise raids on hostels and other places vulnerable to incidents of and having the Potential of ragging.
2. To conduct on the spot enquiry in to any incident of ragging.

Punishment for Ragging

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following

1. Cancellation of admission
2. Suspension from attending classes
3. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
4. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
5. Withholding results
6. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
7. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
8. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 2 years.
9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.

10. Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.

An appeal against the order of punishment by the AntiRagging Committee shall lie

1. In case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of the University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University
2. In case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor
3. In case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution, as the case may be.

The institutional authorities shall intimate the incidents of ragging occurred in their premises along with actions taken to the Council from time to time.

Anti Ragging Act

“The most inhumane act is the offence of Ragging on a human being by an inhuman creature.”

Ragging is an offence under MAHARASHTRA PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT, 1999 which defines ragging as:

"Causing, inducing, compelling or forcing a student, whether by way of practical joke or otherwise, to do any act which detracts from human dignity or violates his/her person or exposes him/her to ridicule from doing any lawful act. By i using criminal force on him/her or by holding out to him/her any threat of intimidation, wrongful confinement, injury or the use of criminal force."

"Ragging in all its forms is totally banned in this institution including in its departments, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sports, cafeteria, etc.) whether located within the campus or outside and in all means of transportation of students whet her public or private. The institution shall take strict action including but not limited to criminal proceeding and/or cancellation of admission against those found guilty of ragging and/or of abetting ragging and the burden of proof shall hereby lie on the perpetrator of alleged ragging and not on the victim. An offence of Ragging may be charged either on a written complaint by the affected or on independent finding of the Anti Ragging Squad.

The Institution is bound by the UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions 2009."

In order that no incidence of Ragging is ever reported at AIT's Institute of Pharmacy, Malegaon has founded an Anti – Ragging Committee which governs the prevention of any means of Ragging either within or outside the college.

There have been no incidents of Ragging at AIT's Institute of Pharmacy, Malegaon till date

MANDATORY READING

Mandatory reading material for all students of **AIT's Institute of Pharmacy, Malegaon**

The legal definition of ragging is as follows:

“Ragging” means the doing of any act which causes, or is likely to cause any physical, psychological or physiological harm of apprehension or shame or Embarrassment to a student and includes,

1. Teasing or abusing of playing Practical joke on or causing hurt to any student.
2. Asking any student to do any act, or perform anything, which he/she would not, in the ordinary course, be willing to do or perform.

Ragging is different from other crimes because the motive is solely to get perverse pleasure. Ragging is also different from other crimes as it is actively promoted by certain sections of the society

Following types of abuses and activities will be termed as ragging:

1. Physical abuse, for example, forcing to eat, drinks or smoke, forcing to dress or undress.
2. Verbal abuse, for example swear words and phrases, direct or indirect derogatory references to the person's appearance, attire, religion, caste, family or chosen field of study
3. Forced activity, for example
 1. Chores for seniors e.g. copying notes, cleaning rooms, etc.
 2. Missing classes. Not being allowed to study.
 3. Staying awake late or getting up at unreasonable times
 4. Singing or dancing or performing in any other way
 5. Using foul language or shouting or cheering loudly.
 6. Misbehaving with strangers, particularly women.
 7. Reading or browsing porno-graphic/objectionable material.

Ragging also constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

1. Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
2. Indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student ;
3. Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
4. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
5. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
7. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
8. Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, posts, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the is comfiture to fresher or any other student;
9. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

OBSERVATION AND DIRECTIVES OF THE SUPREME COURT:

The Supreme Court of India has observed that enrolment in academic pursuits or a campus life should not immunize any adult citizen from the penal provisions of the laws of the land. According to the directions of the Supreme Court if any instance of ragging is brought to the notice of the administration or the faculty, it is legally binding on us to report the matter to the Local Police. See www.aitop.org/antiragging for more details.

Our Directives to the seniors:

1. Any interaction between freshers' and seniors where the seniors are friendly, welcoming and non-aggressive is encouraged.
2. Seniors may solicit participation in clubs and other activities by announcing promotional events at well designated times and places. However, no fresher should be forced to attend. Participation by fresher's can only be voluntary.
3. Seniors are expected to maintain self-imposed discipline and restraint. In particular, they must be careful about:
 1. Any "interaction" outside public areas.
 2. Visiting fresher's rooms during the interaction period, or inviting fresher's to their rooms.
 3. Forcing fresher's to sing dance or perform in any way under the guise of "talent search" or "interaction".
 4. Being over-enthusiastic about making fresher's participating in student activities - cultural or sports.

ANTI- RAGGING MEASURES AT AIT's Institute of Pharmacy, Malegaon Ragging is totally prohibited in the AIT's Institute of Pharmacy, Malegaon campus and anyone found guilty of ragging and / or abetting ragging whether actively or passively, or being a part of conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with UGC Regulations 2009 as well as under the provisions of any penal law for the time being in force. As per UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009, Ragging constitutes one or more of any of following acts:

1. Any conduct by any student whether by words spoken or written or by act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student
2. Indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension there of in any fresher or any other student
3. Asking any student to do any act which he/she will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student
4. Any act by senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher
5. Exploiting the service of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students
6. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students
7. Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts/ gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person
8. Any act or abuse by spoken words, email, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from activity or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student
9. Any act that affects the mental health and self- confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.
10. AIT's Institute of Pharmacy, Malegaon ensures that the congenial and welcoming environment is given to the freshers in its institutes.

ANTI – RAGGING MISSION

Report on activities (2017 – 2018)

The College has taken following steps during 2017 - 18 for the compliance of UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009. The Anti-ragging committee and Anti-ragging squad are already established in the academic year 2017-18.

1. The details of Anti – ragging Mission has been given wide reach by publishing it in the prospectus of the institution. It contains the instruction and warning of prohibiting the ragging, Anti – ragging Mission Statement, punishment for ragging and Anti_ragging helpline numbers at the institution in English and Marathi languages.
2. The undertaking by students regarding non-involvement in ragging act is introduced in admission process.
3. On the eve of foundation day and freshers welcome function. The students are made aware of Anti – ragging Mission of the institution by our beloved principal Dr.M.N.Qureshi
4. As per the direction of UGC the Anti – ragging video show was organized in our institute. The freshers and seniors students in large numbers were participated in this activity.
5. The representatives of students Prof.M.S.Mirza, Prof.C.P.Kulkarni and One girl and two boys student from each year are nominated on the Anti -ragging Committee and Anti-ragging Squad respectively for the academic year 2018-19.
6. The Mentoring Cell is constituted under the guidance of Dr. M.N.Qureshi (Principal) , Prof.M.S.Mirza(S.G.Lecturer) and Prof.C.P.Kulkarni (S.G.Lecturer), and group of six students of First year and Second Year accordingly.
7. The Students Co-ordination Committee consisting of Mr. Mahesh Sonwane as students co-ordinator and students members of all committees constituted under Anti-ragging Mission as members is constituted for having co-ordination of the Anti-ragging activity.
8. The ‘Parents – teachers – counsellor – freshers Meet’ was organised in our institute and also conduct a programe on “Ragging prohibition act “ discussed and shared with the Dr. M.N.Qureshi (Principal) and Mr. Gavitt (P.I., Pawarwadi Police Station) had delivered speeches and provided guidance on ‘the issue of ragging and role of parents and teachers in anti-ragging mission’, and ‘the effects of ragging on personality of students and remedies thereon’ respectively. The parents, teachers and freshers had actively participated in this program.
9. The Anti-ragging Mission subjects were given for competitions such as elocution and drawing during whole Annual.
10. The students of our pharmacy I, II, have undertaken and completed the practical work under Legal Literacy and Legal Awareness on the Anti – ragging Laws and issues.
11. The Anti-ragging Mission of the College is displayed on the internet through college Website www.aitiop.org/antiragging.

PREVENTIVE ASPECTS OF RAGGING

(A) Systemized Efforts for Socio-Academic Integration Of New Entrants.

1. Address of the Head of the constituents.

Heads of all constituents of the University, during their address/discussions to/with parents/guardians, admission aspirants/ fresh entrants students at the time of counseling meets, new batch induction on registration, batch inaugurals and other such occasions, should invariably assure the students and parents about full protection and support against any attempts of ragging by seniors while briefly introducing the 'Anti Ragging Policy' of the institute. The efforts during such meets are directed towards achieving socio-academic integration of new entrants with the specific merit oriented environment of mutuality and trust of the University.

2. New batch inaugurals

Each constituent may organize, in a befitting manner, inaugurals of new batches, towards progressive socialization efforts. Head of the Institutes and faculty members, during such inaugurals may provide to the students, the guidelines on behavioral norms.

3. Fresher's Party

Seniors, be encouraged to organize, "Welcome Party" for new entrants. For this purpose an organizing committee be constituted, out of senior students of which, a senior faculty member will be the Ex-Officio- Chairman cum Patron. Such a party, by senior students, be organized within first fortnight, of the beginning of academic session. Head of the Institution and faculty members, to the extent possible, should participate in such a party.

4. Professional Counseling

Professional counsellors attached to the constituents / University should provide counseling to 'fresher' in order to prepare them for the socio-academic life ahead particularly for adjusting to life in hostels.

5. Mentoring Cells

Each constituent of the University should have a 'Mentoring Cell'- functioning under guidance of a Senior Faculty and in direct supervision of the 'Professional Counsellor'. Such a cell would be manned by senior students. There should be one senior student mentor for a specified group of 06 junior students. Membership to the 'mentoring cell' by senior students would be on voluntary basis by inviting applications and nominating membership on year to year basis.

6. Social, Cultural, Sports Activities

Each constituent of the University should organize setting up of social cultural and sports committees, under charge of a faculty member. Membership of these committees will be on a mixed group pattern, with a cross section of senior and junior students. Other students' related areas of activities should also be coordinated through identical pattern of committees.

7. Watch and Ward arrangements

Each constituent should identify all vulnerable locations, and ensure keeping a constant vigil and watch at such locations including monitoring of the atmosphere and the environment at eating 'Joints' (Canteens, Cafes, 'khoka', Dhabas etc). Hostel / accommodations, where freshers are accommodated, are required to be carefully guarded if necessary, by posting security personnel and placed in charge of a warden.

8. Migration Certificates, Character Certificates, School Leaving Certificates

- Migration/ School leaving certificates and character certificates, issued by the previous institution/university to the admission aspirants to any of the University constituents should be carefully checked for any entry relating to the student's involvement in "ragging" activities at the time of registration for admission.
- Migration certificate issued by the constituents/University to the students should have an entry apart from general conduct and behavior, whether student had participated in and in particular was punished for "ragging".

(B) Wide – dissemination of Anti-Ragging Policy

1. Admission Advertisements

2. All admission related advertisements of the University should indicate
3. that "ragging is banned in all constituents of the University".
4. Prospectus and Admission forms (Affidavit) :
 - All prospectus should contain a specific caution that "ragging is banned in all constituents of the University, and anyone found indulging in ragging, is likely to be punished appropriately which may include expulsion from the institute." While providing a gist of the "Anti- Ragging Policy" of the University, and also the likely punishments for indulging in such activities, in the prospectus for admission to any constituent of the University, number of cases of "ragging" in the previous academic year/session, the punishment awarded to the guilty should also be mentioned.
 - All forms for admission to any course of the University to any of the constituents should contain a specific declaration to be signed by the student seeking admission. The form, in which such a declaration has not been signed, should summarily be format is as below:

12.0 Prevention and Prohibition of Ragging

In view of the directions of the Honorable Supreme Court in SLP No. 24295 of 2006 dated 16-05-2007

and in Civil Appeal number 887 of 2009, dated 08-05-2009 to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge

of ragging, in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 23 read with Section 10 (b), (g), (p) and (g)

of AICTE Act, 1987, the All India Council for Technical Education has notified Regulations for prevention

and prohibition of ragging in AICTE approved Technical Institutions vide No. 37-3/ Legal/ AICTE/ 2009

dated 01.07.2009 available on the AICTE Web-Portal [http:// www.aicte-india.org/anti.htm](http://www.aicte-india.org/anti.htm)>download.

All AICTE approved Technical Institutions have to comply the provision made in the above Regulations.

Any violation of above AICTE Regulations for prevention and prohibition of ragging, shall call for punitive

action against erring Institutions as per provisions made in the above said Regulations.

The Institutions shall have to step up Anti-Ragging mechanism by way of adequate publicity through

various mediums:

- Constitution of Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti Ragging Squad;
- Setting up of Anti-Ragging Cell;
- Installing CCTV cameras at vital points;
- Anti-Ragging Workshops;
- Updating all Web sites with Nodal Officers complete details, alarm bells etc.;
- Regular interaction and counselling with the students;
- Identification of trouble-triggers;
- Mention of Anti-Ragging warning in the Institution's prospectus and information Booklets/ Brochures shall be ensured; and
- Surprise inspection of hostels, student's accommodation, canteens, rest cum recreational rooms,

toilets, bus-stands and any other measures which would augur well in preventing/ quelling ragging and any uncalled for behaviour/ incident shall be undertaken.

The Institution approved by AICTE may be requested to hold Workshops and Seminars on eradication of

The size of posters should be 8x6 feet.

The Institution may be requested to submit online compliance of Anti-Ragging Regulations on curbing

the menace of ragging in the Technical Institutions, 2009 at www.antiragging.in.

Institutions may be requested to make it compulsory for each student and every parent to submit an online

undertaking every academic year at www.antiragging.in and www.amanmovement.org.

Further, the attention of all the Institutions may also be invited to the Third amendment in UGC Regulations

dated 29th June, 2016 expanding the definition of ragging by including the following:

“(j) Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student

(fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic, identity, place of

birth, place of residence or economic background”.
